



FYI... You will be asked to vote on six Washington State Initiatives, 1433, 1464, 1491, 1501, 732 and 735.

Looking for information and guidance regarding these initiatives, I visited our Washington State AAUW website to see if there were any specific recommendations. There were none, but there was a list of Approved Public Policy Principles. That list would indicate that we as AAUW members should be supporting I-1433, and I-735. Initiative 1-464 is difficult. Citing the Approved Public Policy Principles, a case may be made for or against I-1464. The Approved Public Policy Principles do not specifically provide guidance for I-1491, I-1501, or I-732. I highly recommend our members research all of these important initiatives before they cast their ballot.

For 2017, Pam Rio and Nancy Stepsis will be Co-chairs for the group. For more information, contact Pam or Nancy.





Clark College's newest building is a 70,000-square-foot STEM Building. STEM is a widely used acronym for science, technology, engineering and mathematics and those subjects are represented in design elements throughout the \$40 million building.

The new building has been a long time coming for Clark College. Work has been underway on the building for eight years.

As the local demand for trained professionals in scientific and technological fields increases, the new building will help better serve students and the community.


