FYI the Washington State Legislature has yet to agree upon a way to meet the WA State Supreme Court's 2012 McCleary Decision, requiring basic K-12 education be fully funded at the state level. The Legislature should act this year as it finalizes the 2017-19 budget, because when it meets in Jan 2018 it will be to address only supplemental budget issues. So levies will again be used during the 2017-18 school year to meet basic educational needs. What if basic education is not fully funded by the Sep 1, 2018 deadline? Unfortunately, I think we will find out.

FYI as of today April 18, 2017, STEM legislation is in committee at the Washington State Senate. If passed and signed, SB 5206 will provide a STEM program for Washington State elementary students.

FYI District 3 Representative Jamie Herrera Beutler has a reputation of avoiding face-to-face town hall meetings. She seems to prefer telephone town halls and small invited group coffees. So recently, a group waited outside her office to try to talk with her; it did not work. A group has invited her to a town hall meeting this week. Another group is planning to invite her for a town hall in May. FYI, about 5 years ago, several Pacific County Democrats—including me—crashed one of her coffees. She handled our interruption very well.




