FYI... this is the third year I have written this column. I try very hard not to be political, but inform our membership about issues and legislation that I think you will be interested in.

So, **FYI**, I again recommend that you visit the national website of AAUW, https://www.aauw.org/ and the AAUW Washington State website at https://www.aauw.org/?s=Washington+State+AAUW. These sites will provide information regarding legislation that, as AAUW members, you will probably want to support.

If you are a (2), (3), or (4), I also recommend that you educate yourselves regarding the candidates that will be on the ballot in November. Then vote for the persons that advocate for issues that are important to you.
